It is recommended that students start Appalachian course work in the summer; students should apply for the summer I term.

HOW-TO Use the Transfer Guide/BDP

The Transfer Guides/BDPs have three sections:

- 1. The NC Community College courses are listed in the top section. Recommended and/or preferred courses are provided, with the equivalent Appalachian courses listed. If a specific course is not listed, students should use the blue hyperlink to access the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA) transfer course list. Students are welcome to choose any CAA course; however, students should choose courses that are available at their institution and satisfy their transfer degree requirements.
- Appalachian courses are listed in the middle section. Students will work with an Appalachian advisor to develop an individual graduation plan. 2.
- Important transfer and major information is listed in the bottom sections. Students should refer to these sections for information regarding program requirements and other important information the department would like 3. students to be aware of.

Please note - Transfer Guides/BDPs are developed based on the approved curriculum for that catalog year. Depending on term of entry and the curriculum posted for that catalog year, programs of study may have changed.
