How-to Use the Transfer Guide/BDP

The Transfer Guides/BDPs have three sections:

1. The NC Community College courses are listed in the top section. Recommended and/or preferred courses are provided, with the equivalent Appalachian courses listed. If a specific course is not listed, students should use the blue hyperlink to access the [Comprehensive Articulation Agreement transfer course list](#). Students are welcome to choose any CAA course; however, students should choose courses that are available at their institution and satisfy their transfer degree requirements.
2. Appalachian courses are listed in the middle section. Once at Appalachian, students will work with an Appalachian advisor to develop an individual graduation plan.
3. Important transfer and major information is listed in the bottom sections. Students should refer to these sections for information regarding program requirements and other important information the department would like students to be aware of.

**Please note** - Transfer Guides/BDPs are developed based on the approved curriculum for that catalog year. Depending on term of entry and the curriculum posted for that catalog year, programs of study may have changed.

Applying to Appalachian:

- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25, from all post-secondary coursework, is required for admission to Appalachian.
- Students interested in applying to Appalachian should submit an application and official college transcripts to be considered for admission.
- Students hoping to attend a summer or fall term are encouraged to apply by February 1st and those hoping to attend in the spring are encouraged to apply by October 15th.

**Community college graduates must obtain a grade of "C" or better in each course and an overall GPA of at least 2.7 on a 4.0 scale to transfer with a junior status, per the state-wide articulation agreement.**

To be admitted to the Reich College of Education for teacher education, a student must meet the following criteria:

- Complete 45 hours with a 2.7 GPA (2.7 GPA must be maintained)
- Complete the Praxis Core
- Be proficient in Reading and English
- Pass the background check

Second Academic Concentration (SAC)

- Required of all Elementary Education majors
- 18 hours each
- **If completing the AA in Teacher Prep, it is recommended that students complete either the Diversity Studies or Social Studies SAC to complete the degree in the time laid out in this plan.**
- **The SAC DOES NOT have to be completed before transferring to Appalachian but should be selected as early as possible.** Students will work with an Appalachian advisor, after transferring, to develop an individual graduation plan.

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [Social Studies](#)** Can be completed: at the community college, Boone Campus, App State Online, or through a combination of online/Hickory Campus

- Students completing the Social Studies SAC can complete 15 hours of the SAC at the community college.

Course that can be taken at the community college to complete 15 hours of the SAC:

American History: POL 120 and HIS 131 or 132 (6 hours)

World History: HIS 111 OR 112 (3 hours)

Choose 3 hours from the following: ANT 220, GEO 111, POL 130, SOC 210 \*PSY 150 will be used to complete the Social Studies SAC



**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [English/Language Arts](#)** Can be completed at Boone & Hickory campuses

- Students completing the Sciences SAC can complete 16 hours of the SAC at the community college

Courses that can be taken at the community college to complete 6 hours the SAC:

ENG 231 OR 232      ENG 251 OR 252      ENG 237

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [Exceptional Learners](#)** Can be completed at Boone campus only

The Exceptional Learners SAC will have to be completed on Appalachian's campus. There are no community college course equivalencies available.

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [World Languages and Cultures](#)** Can be completed at Boone campus only

- Foreign Language options at Appalachian include Chinese, French, German, Japanese, and Spanish
- If the community college is offering the language of interest, student can begin the SAC before transferring.
- If desired foreign language is not offered, students should plan to complete SAC at Appalachian.

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [Global Issues](#)** Can be completed at Boone & Hickory Campuses

The following courses can be taken at the community college to complete the SAC. Students should select courses from a minimum of two different subject areas/prefixes.

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [Language & Literacy](#)** Can be completed at Boone campus only

The Language & Literacy SAC will have to be completed on Appalachian's campus. There are no community college course equivalencies available.

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [Elementary Mathematics](#)** Courses outside the community college equivalents listed below (which may be available at Hickory), can be completed at Boone campus only

- Students pursuing the Elementary Mathematics SAC should take MAT 171, 172, 263 OR 271 as part of their AA degree. Completion will satisfy 4 hours of the SAC requirement.

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [Media Studies](#)** Can be completed at Boone campus only (outside the community college courses listed below which may be available at Hickory/online)

- Students completing the Media Studies SAC can complete 6 hours of the Sac at the community college.

Course that can be taken at the community college to complete 6 hours of the SAC:

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [Music](#)** Can be completed at Boone Campus Only

Students completing the Music SAC should plan to complete all SAC coursework at Appalachian.

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [The Sciences](#)** Courses outside the community college equivalents listed below can be completed at Boone Campus only

- Students completing the Sciences SAC can complete 16 hours of the SAC at the community college.
- Students should take a UGETC science sequence (AST, BIO, CHM or PHY) as part of their AA degree

Another 8 hours of the following courses can be taken at the community college to complete 16 hours of the SAC:

**Second Academic Concentration (SAC): [Psychology](#)** Courses outside the community college equivalents listed below can be completed at Boone Campus only
