If a specific course is not listed, students 1. should use the blue hyperlink to access the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement transfer course list. Students are welcome to choose any CAA course; however, students should choose courses that are available at their institution and satisfy their transfer degree requirements.
- Appalachian courses are listed in the middle gray section. Once at Appalachian, students will work with an Appalachian advisor to develop an individual graduation plan.
