HOW-TO Use the Transfer Guide/BDP

The Transfer Guides/BDPs have three sections:

- 1. The NC Community College courses are listed in the top section. Recommended and/or preferred courses are provided, with the equivalent Appalachian courses listed. If a specific course is not listed, students should use the blue hyperlink to access the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement transfer course list. Students are welcome to choose any CAA course; however, students should choose courses that are available at their institution and satisfy their transfer degree requirements.
- 2. Appalachian courses are listed in the middle section. Once at Appalachian, students will work with an advisor to develop an individual graduation plan.
- 3. Important transfer and major information is listed in the bottom sections. Students should refer to these sections for information regarding program requirements and other important information the department would like students to be aware of.

Please note - Transfer Guides/BDPs are developed based on the approved curriculum for that catalog year. Depending on term of entry and the curriculum posted for that catalog year, programs of

Notes

Community college graduates must obtain a grade of "C" or better in each course and an overall GPA of at least 2.7 on a 4.0 scale to transfer with a junior status, per the state-wide articulation agreement.

To be admitted to the Reich College of Education for teacher education, a student must meet the following criteria:

* Complete EDU 2000 & EDU 2100 with a C or better

* Complete 45 hours with a 2.7 GPA (2.7 GPA must be maintained)

* Complete the Praxis Core
