- Passing PRAXIS Core test or being exempted (based on SAT or ACT scores)
- A current Criminal Background Check (within 6 months of your application to teacher education)
- Cumulative GPA of 2.7 or higher
- 30 semester hours or more
- A minimum grade of "C" (2.0) must be earned in RC 1000, EDU 2000 & EDU 2100
