HOW-TO Use the Transfer Guide/BDP

The Transfer Guides/BDPs have three sections:

- 1. The NC Community College courses are listed in the top yellow section. Recommended and/or preferred courses are provided, with the equivalent Appalachian courses listed. If a specific course is not listed, students should use the blue hyperlink to access the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA) transfer course list. Students are welcome to choose any CAA course; however, students should choose courses that are available at their institution and satisfy their transfer degree requirements.
- 2. Appalachian courses are listed in the middle gray section. Some majors recommend students transfer after 30 hours are completed, which is listed in red at the top of the transfer guide/BDP. Students should use this information when planning their transfer process.
- 3. Important transfer and major information is listed in the bottom white sections. Students should refer to these sections for information regarding program requirements and other important information the department would like students to be aware of.

Please note - Transfer Guides/BDPs are developed based on the approved curriculum for that catalog year. Depending on term of entry and the curriculum posted for that catalog year, programs of study may have
