**Applying to Appalachian:**

- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25, from all post-secondary coursework, is required for admission to Appalachian.
- Students interested in applying to Appalachian should submit an on-line application and official college transcripts to be considered for admission.
- Students hoping to attend a summer or fall term are encouraged to apply by February 15th and those hoping to attend in the spring are encouraged to apply by October 15th.

**Advising & Community College Course Selection:**

- Students should work with their community college academic advisor to ensure appropriate course selection for AA degree completion.

**Science Concentration: Students can complete up to 16 hours of required sciences at the community college, depending on availability:**

- 8 hours of a natural science sequence should be completed.
- Two four hour science courses from Biology, Chemistry, Physics, or Geology.

To be admitted to the Reich College of Education for teacher education, a student must meet the following criteria:

- Complete CI 2300 and FDN 2400 with a C or better
- Complete 45 hours with a 2.7 GPA (2.7 GPA must be maintained)
- Complete the Praxis Core
- Be proficient in Reading and English
