Program Admissions Notes:

A 2.5 GPA is required for admission to the RN to BSN program. RN to BSN students will be admitted to the university and then the program cohort.

RN to BSN Admission Requirements:

- Admission to the University
- Hold an Associate in Applied Science degree in Nursing, an Associate Degree in Nursing (from an accredited institution) or a Diploma in Nursing from an accredited hospital nursing program
- Hold a current, unrestricted and unencumbered registered nurse (RN) license to practice nursing in North Carolina or a compact state
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 calculated over all college coursework (cumulative GPA as calculated by the Department of Nursing)
- Complete 60 hours of lower-division coursework (RN to BSN Required Core, Cognate Courses, elective courses) and 30 hours of major nursing courses. Please see the <u>RN-BSN prerequisite NCCC course sheet</u>.
