- Field Archeology (ANT 3120) is also required and is offered only in the summer. Recommended to take the summer after Junior Year. May take summer after sophomore year if prerequisite is met and the course has space.
- Study abroad is encouraged. Some students opt for taking a study abroad field course to substitute for Field Archeology; many field schools are offered internationally and within the U.S.
- Departmental Honors: any course may be contracted as an HONORS course if the instructor agrees and the course is suitable; HONORS research and thesis courses can fill the "open courses" at the Senior level.
- Foreign language requirement:
 - o Student must take the Foreign Language Placement Test to determine starting course for the foreign language sequence. Foreign Language courses can also be taken later in the course of study, but earlier is better
 - o If Foreign Language 1010 & 1020 taken for prerequisite purposes, they will count in place of 6 hours of Free Electives (3 hours per course).
 - o FL 1030 may substitute for FL 1010 & 1020 for some languages; FL 1060 may substitute for FL 1040 & 1050 for some languages.
 - o Foreign Language courses may also be taken summer semesters, but note the need to leave one summer semester free for field school
- Residency Requirements:
 - o 31 hours overall must be from ASU
 - o 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
 - o 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
 - o Final 30 hours must be courses taken through ASU (includes internships, study abroad taken through ASU)
