- The IND-Furniture Design program includes a 4-year studio sequence. This begins with INT1001-INT1002 in the Freshman year; IND2411-IND2421 in the Sophomore year; IND3701-IND3200 in the Junior year; and IND4100-IND4110 in the Senior year. These courses must be taken in sequence, and failure to complete any one of these 8 classes with a 'C' or better can delay matriculation by a full year.
- INT 1001 and INT 1002 should be completed in the Freshman year. These courses are semester-specific and MUST be taken sequentially as indicated in the plan.
- IND 1010, IND 2201, and IND 2012 must be taken freshman year but are not semester-specific.
- The IND-Furniture Design program requires a Minor in Marketing, 18 hours.
- All IND students must pass the Sophomore Portfolio Review (IND 2000) in order to take Junior and Senior-level IND courses. This is a 0-credit course graded on a S/U basis. Students should register for this class in the Spring semester of their Sophomore year. Students must have a declared major in IND and have completed the following Prerequisites with a C or better in order to be considered for the Portfolio Review: IND 1010, IND 2012, IND 2201, IND 2120, IND 2411 or IND 2421, ENG 2001 or its equivalent.
- The following classes count as Gen Ed classes and fulfill major requirements:
 - ECO 2030 may be used in GEN ED: Liberal Studies Experience with Social Science (SS) designator.
 - IND 2012 may be used in GEN ED: Liberal Studies Experience with Fine Arts (FA) designator.
 - ART 2130 may be used in GEN ED: Liberal Studies Experience
 - MAT 1030 Quantitative Literacy
- Students are required to complete a professional Internship (IND 4900). This should be completed in the summer between the junior and senior year, or later.
