ADVISING REMINDERS

<u>Chemistry prerequisite change:</u> Effective fall 2017, all students registering for General Chemistry I will be required to have completed ONE of the following:

- MAT SAT 520+ / 550+ for those who took it March 2016 or later
- Passing the math portion of the TCPE (Toledo Chemistry Placement Exam)
- Credit for MAT 1020 (MAT 171) or higher

Athletic Training: The Commission on Accreditation for Athletic Training Education (CAATE), has now mandated that the required degree to become an Athletic Trainer will be a master's degree. Students who enter the University during the 2017-2018 catalog year will have the opportunity to apply for admission to the undergraduate athletic training program during the fall semester of 2017.

Transfer Priority Application Deadlines

Transfer priority application deadlines provide transfer students the best chance for admission as well as housing and scholarship opportunities. *All transfer applicants are reviewed and receive decisions on a rolling basis, which means that applicants are reviewed and decisioned until the incoming class is full.* It is recommended that transfer students complete applications for admission as early as possible. Transfer admission decisions are typically released within two to four weeks after completing the application.
