
What is the Office of Transfer Services?

Appalachian continues to make great strides in our commitment to transfer students, most notably with the opening of the Office of Transfer Services on July 1st, 2014. The new office aims to provide transfer students with the help, support and advice they need to be successful at Appalachian. The office combines the roles of the former Office of Transfer Articulation and Jump Start Appalachian, as well as creating several new positions to better serve the needs of Appalachian's transfer students: a Transfer Transition Advisor; an Admissions Counselor; and an Associate Director. The role of Beth Watts, the Transfer Transition Advisor, is to provide academic advising for prospective and admitted transfer students. In this capacity, Beth is a resource for community college advisors. She is currently working on a set of Transfer Four-Year Guides. The guides map courses that students can take as part of their community college program that will work towards their major at Appalachian. The guides can be found here:

Jump Start Appalachian

Jump Start is a transfer student support program at Appalachian. We visit our partner community colleges on a regular basis to help students find answers to any questions they might have about Appalachian. We serve students from other colleges via email outreach, or through the Jump Start Appalachian facebook group. We can arrange for students to meet faculty and staff in the department of their major. The Jump Start transfer student mentors also work with new students to help them get connected once they transfer to Appalachian. One of the key functions of the Office of Transfer Services is the evaluation of transfer credit. Three members of staff work directly with this function: Selena Dollar, Traci Hartley, and Jenna Reed. The office provides a range of services, including:

- Course Equivalency Search
 This system is used to see how courses from other institutions may transfer to Appalachian.
- Preliminary evaluations
 Students can now prepare their own preliminary credit evaluations using the recently improved Course Equivalency Search.
- Petitions for credit Students who feel they have not received the credit they deserve for a particular course can petition through the Office.
- Gen Ed Exchange
 Gen Ed Exchange allows students entering
 Appalachian to meet Gen Ed requirements by
 completing an Associates of Arts or
 Associates in Science in their first semester of
 enrollment at Appalachian.
