 Students hoping to attend a summer or fall term are encouraged to apply by February 15th and those hoping to attend in the spring are encouraged to apply by October 15th.

- If the AA degree is completed, students can estimate 3 years at Appalachian to complete the BS degree. Incoming transfer students should take at least PH 2000, PH 2200, and a Stats class (if MAT 152 not taken at community college) their first semester at Appalachian.
- For students who are considering a pre-professional track following graduation (pre-med, PT, OT, nursing, etc.,) they can use guided electives to fulfill prerequisite requirements.
